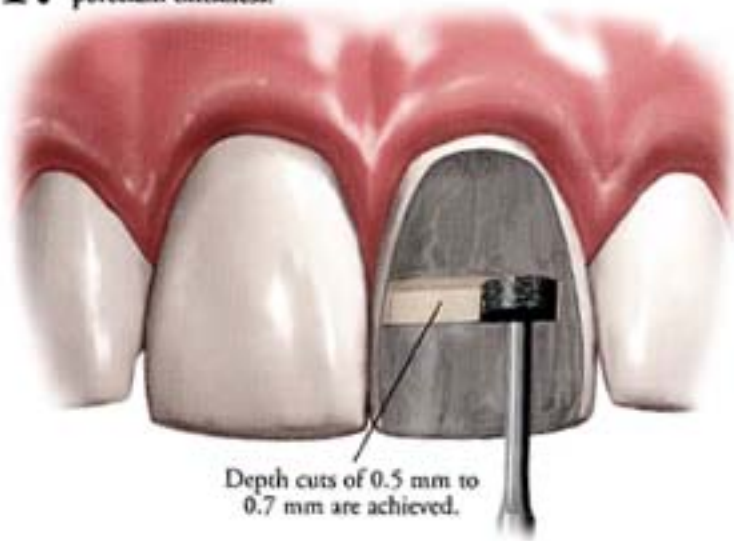




Preparation Guide

Veneer Preparation

- 1.** A depth cut is accomplished to ensure a uniform preparation and porcelain thickness.



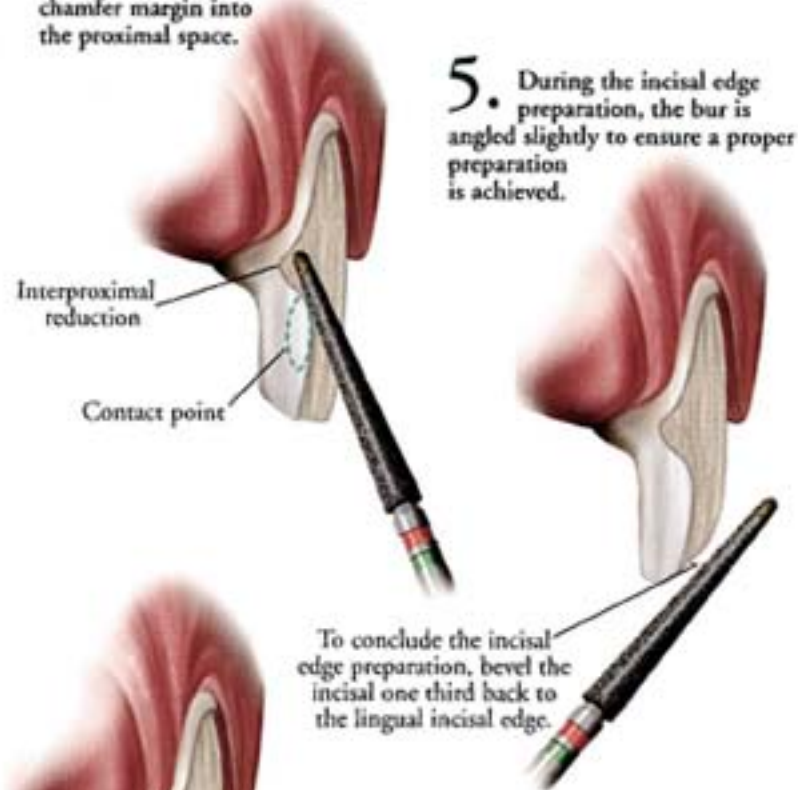
- 2.** The remaining enamel surface is uniformly prepared to match the initial depth cut.



- 3.** Proper chamfer preparation is vital in enabling an adequate bulk of porcelain.



- 4.** The interproximal preparation is extended from the gingival chamfer margin into the proximal space.



- 5.** During the incisal edge preparation, the bur is angled slightly to ensure a proper preparation is achieved.

To conclude the incisal edge preparation, bevel the incisal one third back to the lingual incisal edge.

- 6.** Undercuts and sharp line angles are eliminated and a deep chamfer is created during the preparation of the lingual chamfer.

The lingual preparation is not necessary on all veneers; it may be utilized on the lingual aspect of the cuspid to reestablish cuspid rise.
